The Town Board spent countless hours researching the idea of creating our own Transfer Station, meeting with land owners, and getting pricing on this option. They also reviewed several options for pick-up along with the option of staying with the Joint Center.

- Starting Monday, August 6th
- **Weekly Pickup**
- **Both Garbage and Solid Waste**
 - One 95 gallon cart for garbage and one 95 gallon cart for recycling to be provided for each Residence within the Town
 - A full informational flyer will be delivered with your carts in the end of July
- All costs will be covered within your taxes (Except for large item pick-up)
- You may continue to use the Joint Recycling Center through September 29th (Any changes to this date will be made on the website)

Controlled Burn

If you are planning a controlled burn, **you must call the Brown County Sheriff's Office (448-4200) AND YOUR local Volunteer Fire Department Chief in advance.**

Residents East of Dickinson Road must call the Denmark Volunteer Chief (863-8466) to leave a message.

Residents West of Dickinson Road must call the Morrison Volunteer Chief Bill Lasee (864-2501).



Calling ahead will alert all emergency responders of your plans and will alleviate confusion at the 911 call center if someone not involved in the burn would report the fire.

A current rabies vaccination certificate must be presented at application.

Fees: \$4.00 for spayed/neutered; \$9.00 for male/female.

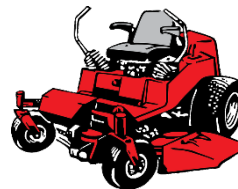

Please keep in mind that it is illegal to blow your grass clippings onto the road. This directly violates Wisconsin State Statutes Sec. 86.01 and Sec 346.94(5), and is unsafe for drivers and especially motorcyclists.

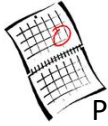

Reminder to Residents from the Zoning Administrator



Prior to considering any rezones, contact the Zoning Administrator, Ben Schauer, before you contact a Surveyor. The Surveyors do not always know all of our regulations.

When considering any changes to your property, including remodeling, new construction, driveways, etc. contact the Zoning Administrator first to find out the requirements of the Glenmore Zoning Ordinance.

If permits are required, the information must be delivered to the Zoning Administrator by the 15th of month 1 to be placed on the Plan Commission agenda of month 2. Final approval comes from the Town Board at its meeting in month 3. **PLAN AHEAD!**

Driveway Permits

A permit is required to construct or enlarge a driveway and/or install, re-install, replace, or move a culvert.

Monthly Town Board meetings are normally held the first Monday of the month beginning at 7:30 PM.

Plan Commission meetings are normally held the second Tuesday of the month beginning at 7:30 PM, if there are agenda items.

Solid Waste/Recycling Pick-Up is on Monday's starting August 6th, except on legal holidays, Memorial Day and Labor Day, which it will then be on Tuesday.

All notices are posted at the Glenmore Town Hall and glenmorewisconsin.org. As a courtesy, many notices are posted at these additional locations: The Door County Coop-Shirley Feed Mill, and The Farmstead Bar. All notices are sent to website subscribers. To sign up for notices, e-mail glenmoreclerk@yahoo.com and enter subscribe in the subject line.

PROCESS FOR OBTAINING A BUILDING PERMIT

1. Contact the Zoning Administrator first at 920-864-2330 or glenmorezoning@yahoo.com. If the building meets the ordinance codes, a meeting will be set up to fill out the paperwork.
2. Meet with the zoning administrator to fill out the Land Use Application and bring along a sketch of the parcel displaying the proposed building/addition.
3. OTHER Permits that may be required prior to getting the building permit. If within 300 feet of an Environmental Sensitive Area or Shore land, a permit from the county will be required. If 200 feet from a county highway, a County Highway Setback Application/permit will be required.
4. Once all requirements are met the Land Use Application will be signed by the Zoning Administrator, all paperwork will be scanned and sent to the Building Inspector Marty Johnson.
5. Resident or Contractor then should contact Marty Johnson, 920-410-6756 and mjohnson@omro-wi.com to obtain the building permit.

Recycling Updates



The Town Board of Glenmore voted on July 2nd, 2018 to contract with Harter's for road side pick-up starting on Monday, August 6th, 2018. Drop off service at the Joint Recycling Center is to be in place through September 29th, 2018 for any of your needs through the transition period.

Recycling Cards Have Been Issued to all Residents!

If you live in the Town of Glenmore, you should have received a Recycling Card to gain entrance into the Recycling Center. If you have not received one, please contact Clerk, Cindy Ossmann.

Replacement cards will be charged a \$5.00 fee payable to the Town of Glenmore.

Updates from Morrison

- If your load of garbage is not tarped or enclosed when entering the recycling center, they will turn you away and not let you enter.
- Construction materials will be accepted in small amounts. Large amounts of construction materials will be turned away.
- Plastic and Glass may be Co-Mingled
- Pie Pans and Tin Foil Must Be Kept Separated
- Aluminum Cans Must be Separated from Tin Cans

NO FEE: Computers, laptops, printers, keyboards, mice, LCD's, servers, fax machines, wire and cabling, telephone systems, modems, stereo systems, video equipment, cell phones, copiers (liquid purged) and microwaves.

FEE: Charges to recycle monitors, TVs and the like have continued to rise. Currently the cost at the recycling center:

Notes from the Chair

As many of you may be aware of, the Town Board has been looking at our solid waste/recycling situation for over a year and a half now. The concerns are that while Glenmore has approximately 40% of the residents using the facility we are paying approximately 65% or more depending on the year, of the cost to run the facility. In the past both boards had looked at this as a joint venture, with Morrison owning the facility and when items came up such as buildings, the gates, the skid steer, etc, Glenmore would pay an appropriate portion towards these capital expenses with the full understanding that it was Morrison's facility, we were just doing our part to help to improve or maintain it. The percentage of the budget we paid previously was based on population, usually 40%, then we raised it to 42% because of elevated costs, but the past 2 years they have asked us to pay 47%. Morrison typically set the budget at \$100,000. Now the past 5 years according to annual reports, the cost has not exceeded \$85,000 for operation. This means if we are paying \$47,000, it is costing Morrison about \$28,000 to provide the same service to more residents.

At our March meeting there were approximately 50 residents there to voice their opinions to continue with Morrison. It was also suggested that Glenmore could possibly start our own transfer station/center.

We held a joint meeting with Morrison's Town Board in April, at which it was stated by one of their members, he viewed this as a joint venture between the Towns. It was also suggested by one of their members we could put a provision in the contract that if the facility came in under budget, Glenmore could get a portion of our contribution back. We countered with if the facility was over budget, Glenmore would need to contribute more, so that both Towns had a small protection. Myself and our Clerk were working with the Attorney to get the proper wording for the contract, but were informed via email within a week that Morrison was no longer interested in adding this protection for the Towns to the contract. I attended the following Morrison board meeting, at which they publicly stated this was not a joint venture, it is a service they provide to Glenmore. Their stance had suddenly changed.

At our Annual Meeting the residents gave the board the ability to look for and purchase land for use as a transfer station. The board began looking at sites we felt were appropriate and talking with land owners, along with visiting sites in other counties to see what worked for them, and getting information on cost to run the facilities. We mentioned several times at monthly meetings that we were looking for sites for this purpose, if residents knew of available sites. The Board put in an offer to purchase on a parcel, then renegotiated it, but the party decided they

would like to keep it for future use. We also contacted landowners to check availability or discuss other possibilities. It is getting to the point in time where it is not feasible to have our own facility up and running effectively before our contract would expire. Morrison also has stated they would not be budgeting until August or September which leaves Glenmore in a bind since we have to have paperwork in to the State for our Recycling Grants by September 15th, and would not have any options other than to sign their proposal, no matter the cost. The other downside is that every year we go through the same situation, we ask to meet earlier in the year to get proposals earlier, and also if a longer contract would be possible, but there was not mutual agreement on these issues.

It was decided at our July meeting to go with the third option and contract for curbside pickup in the Town. The first pickup will be August 6th. The bins will be getting delivered by Harter's in the coming weeks. There will be one solid waste and one recycling bin per residence. When delivered there will be a flyer with placement instructions, what is allowed in each bin, a schedule and Harter's contact information. They do provide scheduled large item pick up and the instructions for that will also be in packets. We are anticipating continuing our agreement with Morrison thru September 29, 2018, to provide time for residents to transition. The Town is looking into the possibility of providing a service for large amounts of recyclables, electronics, or large items a few days throughout the year and will announce those details when finalized.

We are aware some will not support this decision, but the Board decided to move forward in a new direction, and ask for cooperation from all residents.
