

CODE OF GENERAL ORDINANCES

TOWN OF GLENMORE

BROWN COUNTY, WISCONSIN

CHAPTER 14

PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

SECTION I. HISTORY

Adopted by the Town of Glenmore at the time of adoption of the Code(See Chapter 1, General Provisions, Section X. Effective Date)

SECTION II. PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

Penalties and enforcement of the Code shall be as follows for the enumerated chapters and sections of this code:

CHAPTER 3. ASSESSMENT

SECTION II-CONFIDENTIALITY OF INCOME AND EXPENSE RECORDS-E.

Penalty Provisions

Not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100), plus the applicable surcharges, assessments, and costs for each violation. Each day a violation exists or continues constitutes a separate offense under this ordinance. In addition, the town board may seek injunctive relief from a court of record to enjoin further violations.

CHAPTER 7. SECTION VIII-DESTRUCTION OF OBSOLETE RECORDS

Not less than fifty dollars (\$50) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100), plus the applicable surcharges, assessments, and costs for each violation. Each day a violation exists or continues constitutes a separate offense under this ordinance. In addition, the town board may seek injunctive relief from a court of record to enjoin further violations.

CHAPTER 8. DOG CONTROL-Final Paragraph

The offending dog's owner and/or the property owner will be notified of the offense and will be assessed the fine of seventy five dollars (\$75.00) for the first offense and two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per time for each subsequent offense.

CHAPTER 9. HOUSE NUMBERING-Final Paragraph

The penalty shall be no less than ten dollars (\$10.00) and not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), plus court costs. Each day is considered a separate violation.

CHAPTER 13- NUISANCE

A. Penalties.

1. 1st Offense. Any person who violates this chapter shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) together with the costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution shall be imprisoned in the county jail until such forfeiture and costs are paid, but not exceeding ninety (90) days.

2. Second and Subsequent Offenses; Penalty. Any person guilty of violating this chapter or any person who has previously been convicted of a violation of this chapter shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1000.00) for each offense, together with the costs of prosecution and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs of prosecution shall be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture and costs of prosecution are paid, but not to exceed six (6) months.

B. Separate Violations. Each day of violation of this chapter constitutes a separate offense.

C. Joint Municipal Court. Fines and fees according to the guidelines of the Joint Municipal Court may be substituted for the above.

CHAPTER 15- RECYCLING

A. Enforcement

1. Any authorized officer, employee or representative of the Town of Glenmore may inspect recyclable materials separated for recycling, post consumer waste intended for disposal, collection sites and facilities, collection vehicles, collection areas of multiple-family dwellings and non-residential facilities and properties, solid waste disposal facilities and solid waste treatment facilities, and any records relating to recycling activities, for the purposed of ascertaining compliance with the provisions of this ordinance. No person may refuse access to any authorized officer, employee or authorized representative of the Town of Glenmore who requests access for the purposes of inspection, and who represents appropriate credentials. No person may obstruct, hamper or interfere with such an inspection.

2. Any person who violates a provision of this ordinance may be issued a citation by the Town of Glenmore Town Board or their designated agent to collect forfeitures. The issuance of a citation shall not preclude proceeding under any other ordinance or law relating to the same or any other matter. Proceeding under any other ordinance or law relating to the same or any other matter shall not preclude the issuance of a citation under this paragraph.

B. Penalties

1. Any person who violates SECTION X may be required to forfeit fifty dollars (\$50) for the first violation, two hundred dollars (\$200.00), and not more than two thousand dollars (\$2000.00) for a third or subsequent violation.

2. Any person who violates a provision of this ordinance, except SECTION X, may be required to forfeit not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each violation.

CHAPTER 18-SOLID WASTE

Not less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), plus the applicable surcharges, assessments, and costs for each violation. Each day a violation exists or continues constitutes a separate offense under this ordinance. In addition, the town board may seek injunctive relief from a court of record to enjoin further violations.

CHAPTER 19-UNIFORM DWELLING CODE

The Building Inspector shall provide written notice of violation of this ordinance or the Uniform Dwelling Code to the permit holder and property owner. All violations shall be corrected within thirty (30) days after written notification unless an extension of time is granted by the Building Inspector pursuant to the Uniform Building Code.

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance or the Uniform Dwelling Code shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$50.00 nor more than \$200.00 for each offense, together with the costs of prosecution. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense

In addition to the foregoing, the enforcement of this ordinance may include the withholding of a building permit, imposition of a forfeiture, injunctive relief, or any other remedy allowed by law or in equity.

CHAPTER 20-WEED CONTROL

A fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per day, beginning on the first day of non-compliance will be assessed to anyone who does not maintain proper weed control as identified by this ordinance. The Town may cause all weeds and other rank growth of vegetation to be cut and removed and the cost thereof charged to the property under Wisconsin Stats. 66.0627.
