CHAPTER 20

WEED CONTROL

WEED CONTROL ENFORCED. Any cropable land that is not tilled or used as cropland shall be totally clipped once a year to maintain weed control and fire control.

Special conditions for Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres consist of the following: CRP acres shall be controlled by spot clipping or spraying prior to May 15th for Canadian thistle and again/or after July 31st for other noxious weeds. In Wisconsin that means you must control Field Bindweed, Leafy Spurge, Canadian Thistle and Wild Proso Millet. Also, Bull Thistle, Plumeless Thistle, Musk Thistle, Spotted Knapweed, Garlic Mustard, Common Burdock, Wild Parsnip, Wild Carrot (Queen Ann's Lace), Horsetail, Giant Ragweed, Pigweed. Also, Purple Loosestrife. All clipping shall be completed by August 15th. It is only necessary to clip the seeds. A long stubble can be left. A fifty (50) foot wide fire break next to buildings and a ten to fifteen (10-15) foot fire break anywhere else shall be clipped around all CRP acres. If you need to spot mow your CRP acres during the nesting season—which is May 15th through July 31st—you will need permission from the Farm Service Agency (FSA) County Committee.

Any person, partnership, corporation or other legal entity that fails to comply with the provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction, pay a forfeiture as specified in Chapter 14-PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT.
